G7 Summit 2026: What is the G7 and What Was on the Agenda at the Évian-les-Bains Summit?



Introduction

The G7 Summit is one of the world's most influential gatherings of advanced economies, where leaders discuss major global challenges ranging from security and trade to climate change and emerging technologies. In 2026, the summit was held in Évian-les-Bains, France, bringing together leaders from the world's leading industrialized democracies along with invited partner countries.

What is the G7?

The Group of Seven (G7) is an informal forum of seven advanced economies that coordinate on global economic, political, and security issues. The members are:

- United States
- United Kingdom
- Canada
- France
- Germany
- Italy
- Japan
- The European Union (EU) also participates in G7 meetings.

The group was created in the 1970s to address global economic challenges. Over time, its agenda expanded to include international security, climate change,

energy, health, technology, and geopolitical issues. Unlike many international organizations, the G7 does not have a permanent headquarters or secretariat. The presidency rotates annually among member countries, with the host country setting the summit agenda.

The 2026 Évian-les-Bains Summit

The 52nd G7 Summit was hosted by France from 15–17 June 2026 in the lakeside town of Évian-les-Bains, located near the French-Swiss border. The venue is historically significant because it previously hosted the G8 Summit in 2003.

French President Emmanuel Macron chaired the summit and invited several partner nations and international organizations to participate in discussions on key global issues.

Major Issues on the Summit Agenda

1. Russia–Ukraine War

The ongoing Russia–Ukraine conflict remained one of the most important topics at the summit.

G7 leaders discussed:

- Continued military, financial, and humanitarian support for Ukraine.

- Efforts to strengthen Ukraine's long-term security.
 - Measures to maintain pressure on Russia through sanctions.
 - Possibilities for achieving a sustainable peace.
- Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy participated in summit discussions and sought continued international backing.

2. Middle East Tensions and Iran

The deteriorating security situation in West Asia received significant attention.

Leaders discussed:

- Rising tensions involving Iran.
- Regional stability and conflict prevention.
- Protection of critical maritime trade routes.
- Ensuring uninterrupted global energy supplies.

The issue was particularly important because instability in the region can affect global oil markets and international trade.

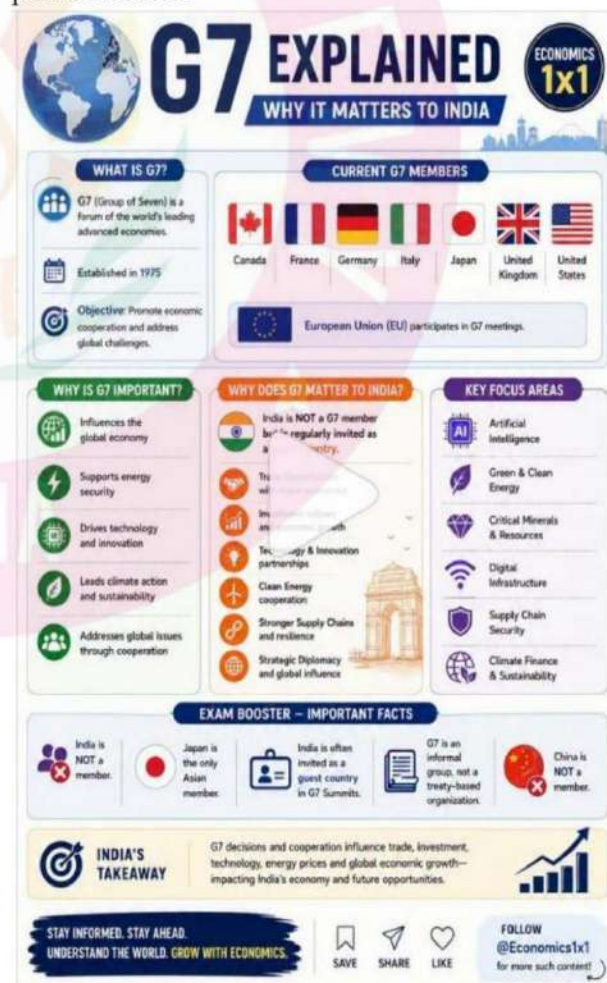

The PoK Assembly has 53 seats.

These include:

- 33 directly elected seats.
- 12 seats reserved for Jammu and Kashmir migrants living elsewhere in Pakistan.
- 5 seats reserved for women.
- 1 seat for religious scholars (Ulema).
- 1 seat for overseas Kashmiris.
- 1 seat for technocrats.

Critics argue that nearly 20 seats are filled through various reservations, reducing the influence of local voters. The 12 migrant seats have become particularly controversial because local residents feel that people who do not live in PoK should not have such a significant role in deciding its politics.

Economic Grievances: The Real Source of Anger

Although the seat reservation issue sparked the latest protests, public dissatisfaction has been building for years.

1. High Electricity Bills

Residents complain about rising electricity prices despite the region generating significant hydropower through projects such as the Mangla Dam.

Many locals argue that they should receive cheaper electricity because their land and resources contribute to power generation.

2. Inflation and Cost of Living

People have been struggling with:

- Rising food prices.
- Shortages of subsidised wheat flour.
- Increasing taxes.
- High unemployment.

These economic difficulties have intensified frustration with the authorities.

3. Resource Exploitation Concerns

Authorities have adopted a tough approach to the protests.

Measures reportedly include:

- Banning the JAAC.
- Arresting protest leaders.
- Filing charges such as sedition and terrorism against activists.
- Deploying security forces.
- Internet restrictions and communication disruptions in some areas.
- Crackdowns on demonstrations.

The clashes between protesters and security personnel have led to multiple deaths and injuries, further escalating tensions.

Why Is History Important in This Issue?

The roots of the protests go beyond current economic problems.

Many residents feel that PoK has historically had limited political autonomy and remains heavily influenced by Pakistan's federal authorities. Critics argue that important decisions regarding governance, development, and representation are often shaped by Islamabad rather than local institutions.

As a result, the current movement is seen by many observers as a demand not only for economic relief but also for greater political participation and accountability.

What Is Happening in Gilgit-Baltistan?

The unrest has also drawn attention to neighbouring Gilgit-Baltistan, another region under Pakistan's administration that was part of the former princely state of Jammu and Kashmir.

Like PoK, Gilgit-Baltistan has witnessed concerns over:

- Political representation.

- Federal government control.

Recent elections in the region have also faced allegations of interference and dissatisfaction among sections of the population.

HISTORICAL TIMELINE: 1947 TO 1949

AUGUST 1947
At Partition, Kashmir was a princely state ruled by Maharaja Hari Singh (Doga Hindu ruler of a Muslim-majority state). He chose to remain independent and did not join India or Pakistan.

OCTOBER 1947
Tribal militias from Pakistan's north-west Frontier, supported by Pakistan, invaded Kashmir.

When the Pakistan Army, backed by the Maharaja Hari Singh, sought India's help and signed the Instrument of Accession on 26 October 1947.

OCT 26, 1947
Lord Mountbatten, Governor General of India, accepted the Instrument of Accession on behalf of India.

1947-JAN 5, 1948
Sikri was the first Indo-Pakistan War continued till January 5, 1948.

On January 5, 1948, a UN-sponsored ceasefire took place.

THE DIVIDED STATE (POST 1949)



Two-thirds of the erstwhile princely state came into India, now called Jammu and Kashmir.

PAKISTAN'S CONTROL OVER POK: THE KARACHI AGREEMENT 1949

During the war, Pakistan set up a provisional government called the "Azad Kashmir Government" in October 1947.

It signed the Karachi Agreement in January 1949. According to the terms and conditions of the agreement:

- Pakistan took control of the defence of POK.
- Islamabad handled the foreign affairs of the region.
- Pakistan administered the northern territories, later called Gilgit-Baltistan, besides the POK.

ADMINISTRATIVE EVOLUTION

Earlier, the entire region of POK was controlled by Pakistan.

Later, POK and Gilgit-Baltistan were separated.

While POK has a separate legislature and government, Gilgit-Baltistan has a different government structure.

However, neither of them has been incorporated into the state of Pakistan.

AFTER 1971: SEEKING CONTROL

After Pakistan was defeated by India, leading to the creation of Bangladesh in 1971, Islamabad turned its attention to POK.

13th INTERIM CONSTITUTION ACT, 1974

According to the Act, POK was given:

- A Legislative Assembly
- A President
- A Prime Minister
- A Supreme Court
- Administrative institutions
